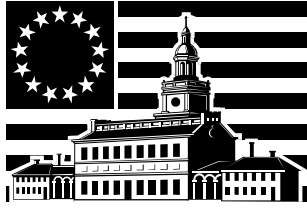

The patriots' first prayer

In anticipation of July 4th, we recall the first prayer delivered in the Continental Congress at Philadelphia on Sept. 7, 1774, by Jacob Duché, rector of Christ Church in that city.



Lord our Heavenly Father, high and mighty King of kings and Lord of lords, Who dost from Thy throne behold all the dwellers on earth and reignest with power supreme and uncontrolled over all the kingdoms, empires and governments; look down in mercy, we beseech Thee, on these our American States, who have fled to Thee from the rod of the oppressor and thrown themselves on Thy gracious protection, desiring to be henceforth dependent only on Thee. To Thee have they appealed for the righteousness of their cause; to Thee do they now look up for that countenance and support, which Thou alone canst give. Take them, therefore, Heavenly Father, under Thy nurturing care; give them wisdom in Council and valor in the field; defeat the malicious designs of our cruel adversaries; convince them of the unrighteousness of their Cause and if they persist in their sanguinary purposes, of own unerring justice, sounding in their hearts, constrain them to drop the weapons of war from their unnerved hands in the day of battle!

Be Thou present, O God of wisdom, and direct the councils of this honorable assembly; enable them to settle things on the best and surest foundation. That the scene of blood may be speedily closed; that order, harmony and peace may be effectually restored, and truth and justice, religion and piety, prevail and flourish amongst the people. Preserve the health of their bodies and vigor of their minds; shower down on them and the millions they here represent, such temporal blessings as Thou seest expedient for them in this world and crown them with everlasting glory in the world to come. All this we ask in the name and through the merits of Jesus Christ, Thy Son and our Savior. Amen.

Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Our church restoration will begin Monday, July 7. This means that our final weekend in the church will be next weekend, July 5-6. Thereafter, we will have Mass downstairs in Priori Hall (the original church for 16 years) for several months.

The major things we are doing are:

- Uncovering 19 stained-glass windows in the apse and above the side altars. These were covered over — for some reason — in 1942.
- Refinishing the pews and replacing the carpet under them with another material more like the terrazzo floors.
- Reshaping the high altar and the platform in the sanctuary to become more rounded and to reflect the original Romanesque design of the church.
- Enhancing the lighting in the nave of the church. The original small lamps under each of the 14 Stations of the Cross will be returned.
- Painting and cleaning will also be done. And that's about it.

By the way, if you did not make a pledge to the recent *Legacy for Our Mission* capital cam-

paign to finance all of this, I will contact you this summer. There are a few other things we would like to do but cannot yet afford: New motors and automatic clock system for our swinging bells is the major one. That's about \$40,000. Would anyone like to help?

This Sunday, June 29, is the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul**. Our archdiocesan cathedral (where Father Magiera and I are in residence with several other priests) is named under the patronage of these two great saints. The sanctuary in the cathedral has a huge beautiful mosaic depicting Saints Peter and Paul, "the pillars of Rome."

At 6 p.m. Rome time (noon Indianapolis time) on Saturday the 28th, at the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls, Pope Benedict XVI solemnly opens the Jubilee Year of Saint Paul, marking two millennia since his birth. At 9:30 a.m. Rome time (3:30 a.m. our time) on Sunday the Holy Father will give the pallium to metropolitan archbishops at Saint Peter's. The pallium is a wool liturgical garment worn by archbishops.

The Vatican has granted a plenary indulgence during the Pauline Year for those who fulfill the usual requirements for confession, Holy Communion and prayers for the Holy Father's intentions "in total detachment from sin," and who also:

- Make a pilgrimage to Saint Paul Outside the Walls in Rome and pray for the Holy Father's intentions at the altar of confession, invoking the Blessed Mother and Saint Paul. (I will have the opportunity to do this when I visit Rome for the diaconate ordination of Sean Danda in October.)
- Participate with devotion in a Mass or other public event dedicated to Saint Paul in any sacred place around the world on the opening and closing days of the Jubilee Year, and on other days in places designated by the local bishop. Anyone who is sick must intend to do so as soon as they are able. You can do this today (Sunday) by attending Holy Mass. Later opportunities for this will be provided locally — more later.

Pope Benedict XVI, in announcing the year of Saint Paul last year, gave some lessons we can learn from Saint Paul:

Evangelization is necessary to Christians. The Holy Father said the Church needs modern Christians who will imitate Paul's missionary energy and spirit of sacrifice. We need to look at our immediate sphere of influence: our family, parish and community. But we should always work to broaden that sphere of influence as much as possible to spread the Kingdom of Christ, like Paul did.

Disagreements are human nature, but charity is eternal. The pope also pointed out that the Pauline year opens on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. They were very different figures with different roles in the Church. There was at times tension between them. But the pope reminded us that together they helped build the Church and showed the world "a new way of being brothers."

Paul also had a famously sharp disagreement with Saint Barnabas, so serious that they split. When the Church seems polarized, we can take comfort that there have always been big disagreements in the Church — and even greater charity.

Our Church is built on the sacrifices of the apostles. It was only a few decades ago that Peter's tomb was found to be buried deep beneath the center altar of Saint Peter's Basilica. Now Vatican experts have discovered a roughly cut marble sarcophagus deep beneath Saint Paul Outside the Walls which, said Pope Benedict, "according to the common opinion of the experts and unopposed tradition holds the remains of the apostle Paul." It should strengthen our Faith to know that our Church was built on the martyrdom of the apostles.

Hey, be ready for martyrdom! These are scary times. New legal challenges are making it criminal to be a believing Catholic on some issues in Canada and elsewhere (and soon to be here!). The pope says not to worry.

The Church's actions are credible and effective only to the extent that Christians are willing to "pay personally for their Faith in Christ in every situation," said Pope Benedict. Where this commitment is lacking, the appeal of the Gospel will be weaker. Paul "lived and worked for Christ; he suffered and died for Him." How current is his example today.

Next weekend (the last in our church for awhile) is the holiday weekend for July 4. Thank God for the blessings that we enjoy as U.S. citizens; pray for our troops overseas; beg God for grace and wisdom for our legislators and leaders.
