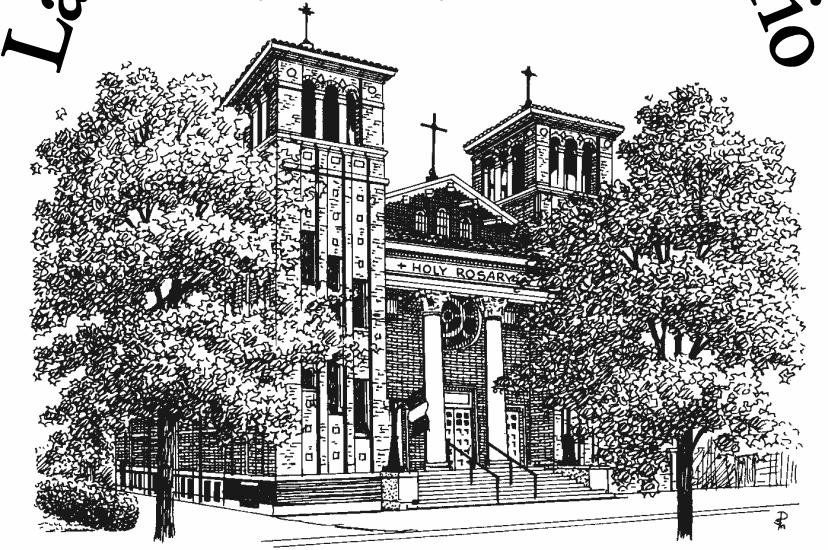

## March of Reparation set for August 16

Prayerful event to coincide with local appearance by anti-Catholic 'comedian'

One of the most anti-Catholic personalities in the world today, Bill Maher, will be performing at the Murat Theatre in Indianapolis on Saturday, Aug. 16, at 8 p.m. A self-proclaimed "politically astute comedian," Maher's shows on television and stage — and soon to be at movie theaters — are notorious for their vulgar vitriol directed at all religion, most especially the Roman Catholic Church.

To counteract Maher's offensive brand of comedy, local Catholic laity are organizing a March of Reparation, along with a Mass for the Defense of the Church, for Aug. 16. Catholics are being asked to turn out in large numbers to pray the rosary, sing hymns and make other acts of public prayer and reparation. It is especially hoped that large numbers of Catholics will be present outside the theater before and after the show.

The exact time and location of the Solemn High Votive Mass for the Defense of the Church will be announced soon. The celebrant, Fr. Dennis Duvelius, will be joined at the altar by Fr. Gerard Saguto and Fr. David Phillipson.

Anyone not familiar with Maher's statements on the Catholic Church would likely be shocked by much of what he has said, repeatedly, throughout his career. A lengthy

list of his quotes — almost all of which are too obscene to be printed here — has been documented by the Catholic League for Religious and Civil Rights. Here is one of the few "clean" attacks he made on April 11, 2008, on the HBO show *Real Time with Bill Maher*:

"I'd like to tip off law enforcement to an even larger child-abusing religious cult. Its leader also has a compound. And this guy not only operates outside the bounds of the law, but he used to be a Nazi and he wears funny hats. That's right. The pope is coming to America this week, and, ladies, he's single! ... If you have a few hundred followers and you let some of them molest children, they call you a cult leader. If you have a billion, they call you 'pope'" (source: transcript provided by *Real Time with Bill Maher*).

All Catholics on earth are considered to be members of the Church Militant, engaged in battle with the world, the flesh and the devil. The March of Reparation is a concrete, visible way to defend our Faith and stand up for all that we believe.

Organizers are asking participants in the March of Reparation to set a good example for others by displaying Christian modesty in their attire: no shorts, tight clothing, short skirts or other immodest clothing.

## Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

### A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Well, once again, here we are down almost where we began nearly 100 years ago. Our church restoration project moves into its second week. We find ourselves in the "crypt church" (now known as Priori Hall) that was used from 1912-1925.

Last weekend we discovered some more "kinks" we have to work out as we celebrate the sacraments "down here." But we will get it all worked out.

I guess being "down under" is quite appropriate since the Holy Father is "down under" in Australia for **World Youth Day**. It actually began Tuesday and will end today (Sunday) with Mass celebrated by Pope Benedict XVI. Lots of young people from the Archdiocese of Indianapolis are there. You can keep track of what they are doing on the archdiocesan web site, [www.archindy.org/wyd](http://www.archindy.org/wyd). Check it out; it's neat. And pray for the success and safety of World Youth Day 2008.

While we are in our crypt church, we have decided to cut down on the use of incense. As you know, incense is used at Mass as a sign of our worship of God. In ancient times, incense was burned to honor royalty. It also can symbolize our prayers rising up to God.

This week I discovered something very interesting about incense in an article written by Rich Maloof, a writer for *MSN Health and Fitness*.

The Maloof article is about a medical research report that indicates incense, traditionally burned in religious ceremonies, can act on the brain to lower anxiety and diminish depression.

**T**he study suggests incense may have the potential to impact brain chemistry.

Researchers from John Hopkins University and Hebrew University administered incense acetate, a component of frankincense, to lab mice. They

learned that it lit up areas of their little mouse brains that control emotion, including nerve circuits affecting anxiety and depression. The findings suggest new avenues for developing medications to treat these conditions, which are the most common causes of psychiatric disability in the U.S.

The study suggests incense may have the potential to impact brain chemistry. Gee, our neighbors across the street at Eli Lilly thought they had the answer with Prozac. They've spent millions developing it and protecting their rights to sell it.

We just might have a simpler solution over here at Holy Rosary. Go to Mass. Smell the incense. Your anxiety and depression might

just decrease. In fact, I think the worship of God at Mass can probably do that anyhow — with or without incense. Think about it.

Here's another tidbit from the news world. This one is from the world of sports. The Associated Press reports that a successful professional soccer player is leaving pro sports to enter the seminary. He's Chase Hilgenbrinck of the New England Revolution, a Major League Soccer team. He's heading for Mount Saint Mary Seminary in the fall to study for the priesthood.

What's even more curious is that young Chase has been playing soccer and living in the Archdiocese of Boston. Gosh, the news media want us to believe that all Catholics in Boston are mad at the Church. I thought I'd read that Bostonians don't even go to Mass anymore.

Chase grew up in a solid Catholic family from the Diocese of Peoria, Illinois. He has always been active in his Faith. He went to Catholic schools. Gee whiz, I thought all of that was ineffective or even harmful to young people. Could it be the news media out of Boston and elsewhere are biased or have an agenda all their own? Perish the thought!

This month marks my tenth anniversary as pastor of Holy Rosary Church. When I came here for my very first Mass on a Saturday I was informed (at the last minute) that a couple in the parish would be celebrating their 40<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary at the Mass.

That couple turned out to be our wonderful

friends, John and Mary Ann Caito. This weekend, again at the Saturday evening Mass, John and Mary Ann celebrate their golden wedding anniversary. We rejoice with them and offer them our prayerful congratulations. We thank John and Mary Ann for their witness to fidelity in a world of broken promises.

God has been good to John and Mary Ann Caito and their family over the years. And God has been good to us for giving us such a wonderful family as parishioners. *Ad multos annos!* (Onward! To many more years!)

I had a nice, long phone chat with Father Magiera this week. His mother's health continues to improve. She is getting the kind of assistance she needs. Father hopes (and I hope) he will be back with us in less than a month.

**Pray** for Mrs. Magiera; pray for our church restoration and for the safety and success of our construction crew.
