## Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

### A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

#### Happy Labor Day weekend!

I remember as a kid that I was always sad around **Labor Day**. In those days — when educators and legislators had brains — school did not begin until the day after Labor Day. (By the way, it's illegal to begin school before Labor Day in some states, like Michigan.)

For us kids — and then later on for us teachers and principals — it was the unofficial end of summer. Back to school! Although I liked school, I still liked summer vacation better.

Even though I am no longer on either side of the desk in the classroom, Labor Day still signals the end of summer as far as I'm concerned. Keep all of our returning students in your prayers. May the Holy Spirit guard and guide each one of them.

**Labor Day** is of course to celebrate, thank and promote the value of labor in our society. The ability to work is a gift of God. And so, Labor Day is first praise of God's gifts of talents, skills and the physical ability to work, thus building up human society.

**Labor Day** always is the first Monday in September. It comes as early as possible this year. The first day of the month of September is also the first Monday in September.

The first national observance of **Labor Day** was on a Tuesday in New York City. It was September 5, 1882. Many people attribute its origins to a Peter J. McGuire. At that time, Mr. McGuire was the general secretary of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners and co-founder of the American Federation of Labor.

Other people claim that it was not Peter McGuire. They say Labor Day was promoted first by Matthew McGuire, another union leader from New Jersey. Who knows? In fact, at this point, who cares? I guess all we can say for sure is that Labor Day was not invented by Al Gore.

In any case, enjoy **Labor Day** — generally a day away from one's usual labor. The best way to observe Labor Day is to thank God through the perfect prayer: the Mass. We will follow our usual civil holiday schedule and have one daily Mass (in the extraordinary form) at 9 a.m.

Pray for those who are out of work; pray for those who are having a tough time in this economy. And pray for the construction crew upstairs working on our church restoration.

This week, the media is buzzing more than usual about "Catholic stuff." In case you have not heard, U.S. Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi was interviewed by Tom Brokaw last Sunday on NBC's *Meet the Press*. In that inter-

view, Mr. Brokaw asked Ms. Pelosi about the Obama campaign and specifically about "life issues." Tom Brokaw asked Madame Speaker, "When does human life begin?"

Nancy Pelosi proceeded to misrepresent the Catholic Church's ancient and consistent teaching on when life begins. She had no clue on the history and nature of the authentic teaching of the Catholic Church against abortion. She basically said the Church has never really been able to figure it out and that our teaching on when human life begins is still sort of "up in the air."

Hopefully someone will send the old girl a copy of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and refer her to paragraph #2271 (among others). Dozens of American cardinals, archbishops and bishops have made well-publicized statements correcting the misinformation that came from Nancy Pelosi on *Meet the Press*.

One of the best statements came from Justin Cardinal Rigali of Philadelphia, chair of the U.S. Bishops Committee on Pro-Life Activities and Bishop William E. Lori of Bridgeport, Connecticut (a Hoosier, by the way), chair of the U.S. Bishops Committee on Doctrine.

They pointed out: "*Since the first century, the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion ... . In the Middle Ages, uninformed and inadequate theories about embryology led some theologians to speculate that specifically human life capable of receiving an immortal soul may not exist until few weeks into a pregnancy.*"

*While in Canon Law these theories led to a distinction in penalties between very early and*

*later abortions, the Church's moral teaching never justified or permitted abortion at any stage of development.*

*These mistaken biological theories became obsolete over 150 years ago when scientists discovered that a new human individual comes into being from the union of sperm and egg at fertilization. In keeping with this modern understanding, the Church teaches that from the time of conception (fertilization), each member of the human species must be given the full respect due to a human person, beginning with respect for the fundamental right to life."*

And let's use our heads. For one thing, any person of even subnormal intelligence realizes that the Roman Catholic Church does not employ American politicians to explain our teachings on *Meet the Press* or any other television show.

Second, any person who has not heard of the Roman Catholic Church's consistent and firm teaching about the intrinsic evil of abortion must be brain dead. And if they don't, they must have been living under a rock. Our pro-life stance is the subject of novels, movies, television shows, political campaigns and even unkind jokes. But everyone knows authentic Catholic teaching on pro-life issues is consistent and unchanging. Give me a break!

Third, don't forget that this is still America. People can and will use the media to make any statement they wish. People of normal intelligence will need to weigh those words, and then judge for themselves.

For example, last Sunday on *Meet the Press*,
