## Prayer to St. Peter Claver

*St. Peter Claver (1581-1654), a Jesuit priest who came from his native Spain to be a missionary in Cartagena, Columbia, spent most of his adult life working to alleviate the plight of Africans being sold as slaves. Canonized in 1888 by Pope Leo XIII, he is the patron saint of African-Americans. His feast day in the ordinary and extraordinary forms of Mass is Sept. 9.*

**Saint Peter Claver, you are known as the "Slave of the Blacks" because of your ministration to the physical and spiritual needs of Africans who were sold into slavery in the New World. Through your work, three hundred thousand slaves were baptized and came to know our Lord Jesus Christ. We ask you to intercede for us today, especially for descendants of the African slaves and all who suffer from racial prejudice. Help us to see each other as God sees us, and to treat one another as the brothers and sisters we truly are. Through the same our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.**

## Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

### A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Well, now we move into weekend number ten of our cozy little crypt church downstairs. Work progresses smoothly upstairs.

How long will we be “down here”? I suspect about 17-18 weeks. I told the construction guys that if we are not back upstairs in the main church by Christmas, they may wish to consider entering the Witness Protection Program. Italian parishes have various methods of dealing with construction folks who get way behind schedule.

Let me reiterate here what I have said before. Please do not go into the church during this work-restoration period. It is off limits! For one thing, we have your safety to be concerned with. The other thing is that our workers do not need to be distracted. We will keep you updated via this Sunday bulletin, pictures and all.

However, the best way to keep up with the project is our parish Web site: [www.holyrosary-indy.org](http://www.holyrosary-indy.org). You can find up-to-date pictures of the current project as well as the architect's renderings of what we hope it will look like when we are finished. Recall that this is all in preparation for our centennial celebration on May 9, 2009.

In the meantime, we continue having Masses in our little “crypt chapel” downstairs. To be

honest, it's working out okay. Folks from the parish did a marvelous job of moving us down. The Knights of Columbus (*Santo Rosario* Council) were a great help.

Thanks to Caris Roller and to Don and Don Murphy for their generosity, expertise and hard work in renovating an old storage room for our Blessed Sacrament Chapel during the restoration. (*Stewardship in Action!*) (Yes, two “Dons.” We actually have three “Don Murphys” in this parish. How appropriate for an Italian parish — three “Dons!” Just don't forget, there is only one “godfather,” I mean monsignor!)

News about our pictorial directory is listed elsewhere in this bulletin. We want to have a new photo of every registered parishioner and family in time for May 2009. Please, schedule a time to have your picture taken. There is no obligation to buy anything. Please take the time to do this. A pictorial directory is a great way to help us know one another in this growing parish.

We also need volunteers to help with this project. Please consider this as well. Call the parish office to offer your help. (*Stewardship in Action!*)

We know that this weekly bulletin letter is not meant to be about me. Yet, many people ask me what precisely I “do” all week — other

than be pastor of Holy Rosary. Well, this week is going to be a particularly busy one:

Sunday (today) I am taking the archbishop's place at Saint Mary Parish in Greensburg. They celebrate 150 years as a parish! I guess Holy Rosary is just a “kid” compared to Saint Mary, Greensburg. Saint Mary's pastor is Msgr. Harold Knueven. He is particularly dear to me; he was my first pastor at my first assignment, Saint Gabriel in Connersville. Msgr. Knueven is 76-years-young and going strong! He has more energy than some newly-ordained.

Sunday (today) also marks the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of religious life for our friend, Sister Rita M. Vukovic. Sister Rita entered the Sisters of Saint Francis Oldenburg 60 years ago. I will celebrate a 60<sup>th</sup> Jubilee Mass for Sister at 4 p.m. at Saint Michael, 30<sup>th</sup> Street and Tibbs Avenue on the Westside. Everyone is invited. *Ad multos annos*, Sister Rita. (In the interest of my continued well being, I won't mention Sister's age. She too is “going strong” as freshman English teacher at Cardinal Ritter High School.)

Monday, (tomorrow) September 8, is the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is “Mary's birthday.” It is also the day my dad died in 2001. He was “born into eternal life” on Our Lady's birthday.

Monday is also the day Archbishop Buechlein will formally dedicate our relocated Bishop Brute College Seminary. Recall that the archdiocese purchased the former Carmelite Sisters' monastery on Cold Spring Road this summer. Our 18 college seminarians live and study there while taking classes at Marian College.

Because of the archbishop's illness, I was in charge of the purchase transaction and subsequent minor renovations and the move. The archbishop is formally dedicating the building to its new purpose with a Mass Monday evening. All priests of the archdiocese have been invited.

When you have a chance to visit there, you will see a large statue of Bishop Simon Brute (our first bishop, now “up” for canonization) displayed. Recall that this statue was a gift to the new Brute Seminary from Holy Rosary.

Wednesday I celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at the cathedral for Saint Luke's Parish.

Thursday (“9-11”) is the annual Blue Mass at Calvary Cemetery Chapel at 6 p.m. This is our annual commemoration and prayer for all those firefighters, law enforcement personnel and victims of the 9-11 tragedy in 2001. Everyone is invited. You should come; it is very “moving.”

Next weekend, we will welcome Father Anthony Quyet Nguyen, a Vietnamese priest from the Diocese of Jackson, Mississippi. He will preach at all Masses asking for our prayers and financial support for the mission of the Diocese of Xuan-Loc in Vietnam. The second collection at all the Masses will benefit 600,000 Catholics in the Diocese of Xuan-Loc, where many villages and towns which were completely devastated by the war are now recovering. Please be generous in this worthy cause!

As vicar general, I make an archdiocesan pastoral visit to Saint Rita Parish next Sunday to
