A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

As we close out the month of September we move into week number 13 of being downstairs in our "cozy" little crypt chapel. I hope this is "lucky 13." So far, so good. The work upstairs is progressing on schedule.

A very special welcome to Father Eric Flood, F.S.S.P., this weekend. Father Flood is the District Superior for the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter. Welcome, Father Flood. We are very grateful for the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter in the archdiocese, particularly in the person of our associate pastor, Father Michael Magiera, F.S.S.P. (You will note that Father Magiera will be on unusually "good behavior" this weekend; the boss is in town!)

Our **Parish Pastoral Council** met last Monday evening. The council members had a brief tour of the construction site better known as our church. We had to do this at the very beginning of the meeting before the sun went down. The electricians have disconnected the light fixtures.

I think the council members were impressed with what has been done so far and with what

will be done. I confess that when we began, I almost burst into tears. "Why did we ever decide to do this?" But now I am more enthused and excited than ever.

The unknowns we discovered have all been good ones so far: stained-glass skylights over the high altar and both side altars, an antique pine wood floor under the pews, a beautiful ornate wood ceiling in the sanctuary, and cherub angels between the sanctuary windows.

The main discussion at Monday's Parish Pastoral Council meeting was planning for our actual centennial celebration on May 9, 2009. Our founding pastor, Msgr. Priori, always considered May 2 the parish's "birthday." One complication for us is that the Archdiocese of Indianapolis celebrates its 175th anniversary on Sunday, May 3, 2009. Archbishop Buechlein is unavailable on May 2, but he is available on **May 9**.

At Monday's meeting, council chair Maggie Greene reviewed the functions of the various committees: e.g., Liturgy, decorations, music, dinner-dance, invitations, etc. She also appointed the leaders for each committee. If you are interested in being part of any of these, please call the parish office (636-4478) and

leave your name and number. Someone will contact you.

The **Saturday 4:30 p.m. Mass on May 9** will be followed by a gala Italian dinner-dance at Primo Banquet Hall South. Advance reservations will be necessary. More about this will be forthcoming.

Parishioner Mary Ann Wyand is editing a centennial book. It will be a special edition of *Eternal Light*. As historian Jim Divita wrote in our parish history in 1984: "*Eternal Light* was a magazine published by Holy Rosary Parish in its early years to make money. In its first years, the magazine was a unique ethnic parish magazine. It produced income surpassing Sunday collections. Many subscribers treasured the commemorative and special issues of *Eternal Light* in later years."

Mary Ann is preparing a special centennial issue of *Eternal Light*. I think of it as a "coffee table book" or one with pictures and anecdotal interviews than anything else. We already have Dr. Divita's book, *The Italians of Indianapolis: The Story of Holy Rosary Catholic Church 1909-1984* (photography and art edited by Michael R. Timpe). It is an excellent history.

Gary Willen is chair of the Liturgy Committee for the Mass. Rosemary Page heads up the group working on the dinner-dance. We invited the *Master's Chorale* to provide the music for the Mass. Our **Italian Street Festival** in June 2009 will be our 26th annual and the centennial year festival. For now, be sure your calendar is marked for **Saturday evening, May 9, 2009**.

From time to time I've mentioned the *Lumen Dei* Business Guild that meets here every First Friday. *Lumen Dei* is Latin for "Light of God."
