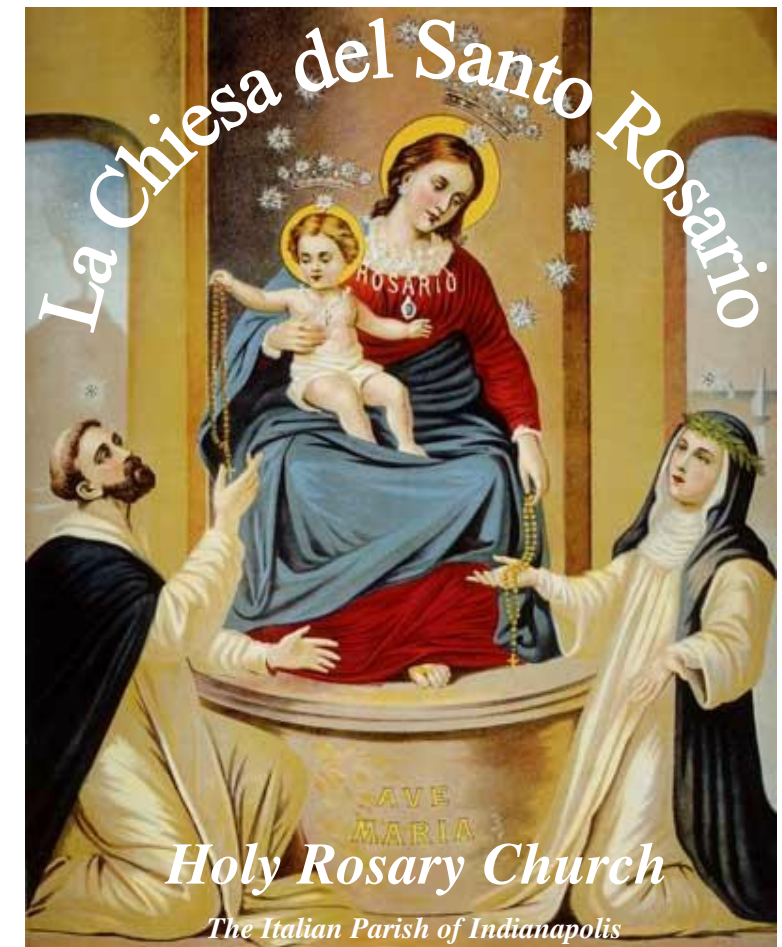

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we observe our patronal feast, **The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary** is October 7th. We observe today what we call "the External Solemnity of Our Lady, Queen of the Holy Rosary." This means that we celebrate our patronal feast on the closest Sunday so more people can attend and so we can do so with greater solemnity.

This memorial recalls the crucial victory of Christian Europe over the Moslems at the naval battle of Lepanto, Italy, on October 7, 1571. The victory was attributed to the Blessed Mother, invoked through the rosary.

This memorial is not just a past event. It reminds us to meditate frequently on the mysteries of Christ with the help of Mary. Such meditation is connected with the Incarnation, life, death and glorious Resurrection of the Son of God.

In preparation for our centennial celebration in May we are having a **nine-month Novena of the Holy Rosary**. It began in August. The rosary is prayed before each Mass on the weekends. Come early and pray the rosary. Craig and Natalie Wenzel are in charge of the folks who've volunteered to help lead the rosary before the 4:30 p.m. and noon Masses (**Stewardship in Action!**); David Walden coordinates those who lead it before the 9:30 a.m. Mass. If you would like to assist, call the Wenzels at 332-7495 or talk to David at the parish office, 636-4478.

Today is also **Respect Life Sunday**. Thank

God for the most precious gift of life! Pray for the safety of the pre-born and for women with problem pregnancies. And pray for our lawmakers and political candidates. We as Catholics must work and pray for candidates that will support the right to life for everyone. The annual Life Chain is today (Sunday) at 2:30 p.m. along North Meridian Street. Our parishioners have been assigned to the same location as last year, between 22nd and 24th streets. See Page 1 in this week's *Criterion* for more about **Respect Life Sunday**.

On Tuesday, October 7, the actual **Feast of Our Lady, Queen of the Holy Rosary**, I will be in Rome! I am traveling there for two reasons. One is the diaconate ordination of Sean Danda.

Many of you know Sean. I've known him since he was a 5th grader at Saint Malachy School in Brownsburg. I served as an associate pastor there before coming here. As a seminarian, Sean helped serve Mass here often. He has been studying in Rome. Sean will be ordained a priest in our cathedral on June 28.

Second, next Sunday is the canonization of the first woman from India to become a canonized saint. She is Sister Alphonsa, a Franciscan Clarist Sister from the State of Kerala in India. Kerala is a very Catholic state in southern India. It is also where the Franciscan Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in our parish have their motherhouse. Know that I will pray for them and for all of you in a special way at the canonization.

At the same time, pray for our brothers and sisters in the Faith in India. As you see from news reports, Christians are being persecuted and terrorized all over India by non-Christian fanatics. They are suffering for our Faith. Pray for peace in India and all over the world.

While I am in Rome I will offer Masses for the following intentions: +*Salvie Caito*, +*Carl Cecil*; +*Tony Constantino*, +*Toni Harrison* +*Rosie Jardina*, +*Anthony La Pinta*, +*Julie Ann O'Donnell*, +*Joy Noone Schaedel*; +*Providence Tantillo*, +*Vera Timpe*.

Later in October the Church will observe a special anniversary for those who are devoted to the Extraordinary Form of Mass — the Traditional Latin Mass. The 20th anniversary of the founding of the **Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter**, to which our own Father Magiera belongs, is October 18. This founding came on the heels of Pope John Paul II's *motu proprio*, *Ecclesia Dei*. As we congratulate the Fraternity, let us remember also to offer our prayers for Father Magiera and all of the Fraternity's priests.

Each fall every parish in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis reminds its members of **Stewardship**. Our annual theme is *Receiving gratefully; Giving generously*. You don't need me to tell you how good God is to *la Chiesa del Santo Rosario*, the Italian Parish of Indianapolis and home of the Traditional Latin Mass in this city.

Next month we will be asking for your card pledging time, talent and financial gifts to the parish and to the annual **United Catholic Appeal**. This latter effort supports **Home Missions** (parishes that cannot make it on their own) and **Shared Ministries** (things we Catholics must do, but do together like educate seminarians, feed the homeless, Pro-Life Ministry, etc.)

As part of that effort this fall, I will also be

contacting two groups of people who have yet to make a pledge in our **Legacy for Our Mission Capital Campaign**. This is the fund drive that is making the restoration of our beautiful church possible. Quite frankly, we would like to do a few things not in the original plan but that would make sense to do as we move forward in this project. These are things like upgrading some wiring, additional decorative painting and uncovering the three stained-glass skylights that we did not even realize existed.

The two categories of people I will contact are: First, those who have been in the parish for some time but have yet to make a gift to the **Legacy for Our Mission capital campaign**. Some may have forgotten about it, others perhaps did not get the information to begin with, and others may simply be cheapskates or be among people who don't like me or Father Magiera. (I know that's impossible to believe! Keep in mind that Christ Himself was not 100% on the popularity polls of His day.)

Second, are the parishioners we have had register within the past two years. Keep in mind that our capital campaign really "ended" in early 2007. We have actually had a record number of new parishioners since then. (God is good to us!) I want to offer them a chance to be part of the restoration project for our centennial.

Item found in another parish bulletin: *In order to include everyone in our new parish pictorial directory we've decided to offer pictures to our senior citizens at no cost. Please call the parish office. We are now shooting seniors for free!*
