Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Here we find ourselves at the end of October, the month of the Holy Rosary. Next weekend it will be November.

Nov. 1 is the **Feast of All Saints**, a holy day. Yet, since it falls on a Saturday it is not a holy day of obligation. Recall that some years ago, the U.S. bishops suspended our obligation to attend Mass on certain holy days if they land adjacent to a Sunday — on a Saturday or on a Monday. The bishops did this for several reasons, not the least of which is the priest shortage.

This suspension of one's obligation to attend Mass on the holy day never occurs for two feasts: Christmas (Dec. 25) and the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8). For example, this year Dec. 8 is a Monday, and that day will be a holy day of obligation.

Saturday, Nov. 1, is the **Feast of All Saints**. We will have two "All Saints" Masses: the Ordinary Form (English Mass) on Friday evening, Oct. 31, at 5:45 p.m. and the Extraordinary Form (Traditional Latin Mass) on Saturday morning, Nov. 1, at 9 o'clock.

November is also the month of the Poor Souls. We remember to pray for the souls in purgatory on the **Feast of All Souls** and throughout the entire month. Note that we have our cus-

tomary "All Souls Envelopes" near the statue of Saint Joseph. He is the patron of a "happy death."

Write the names of your beloved faithful departed in the spaces provided on the envelope. A monetary offering is optional. Leave the envelope in the basket near the Saint Joseph statue. We collect them often. We will place these names on the altar for All Souls Day Masses and at all the Mass during November.

Now, **All Souls Day** is a little trickier! Recall that the Ordinary Form of the Mass (English Mass) and the Extraordinary Form of the Mass (Traditional Latin Mass) follow two different liturgical calendars. Often these liturgical calendars coincide; we celebrate the same feast on the same day. Other times, this is not the case.

For the Ordinary Form of the Mass, the *Ordo* (liturgical calendar and directives) calls for **All Souls Day** to be observed on Sunday, Nov. 2. Hence, the English Masses on Nov. 2 will be for the Feast of All Souls. This is one of the days a priest has the privilege of offering three Masses. In light of this, we will have extra English Masses on Sunday, Nov. 2, at 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. Attend all three Masses that day or "sleep in." (This is the same night the Colts play the Patriots. I hope we don't have to consider them among the departed!)

For the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, the

Ordo (liturgical calendar and directives) calls for **All Souls Day** to be transferred to Monday, Nov. 3. Therefore we will have three Masses in the Extraordinary Form on Monday, Nov. 3, at 6:30 a.m., noon and 7 p.m.

Also, Monday, Nov. 3, is the day before our national elections. We will have continuous **Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament** all through the day between Masses. We beg for the Wisdom of the Holy Spirit upon all voters and all running for political office.

Confused yet? Well, we will all figure it out together. The most important thing is that we pray for the **Poor Souls in Purgatory** all during the month of **November**. Remember to pray for those forgotten souls who have no one to pray for them.

Continue to be conscious of our responsibility to have Masses offered for our beloved faithful departed throughout the year. Our request list for Mass intentions isn't as crowded as it has been. Now might be a good time to contact the parish office to "request Masses."

Each fall every parish in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis reminds its members of stewardship. Our annual theme is *Receiving gratefully; Giving generously*.

Next month we will be asking for your pledge card of time, talent and financial gifts to the parish and to the annual **United Catholic Appeal**. This latter effort supports **Home Missions** (parishes that cannot make it on their own) and **Shared Ministries** (things we Catholics must do together like educate seminarians, feed the homeless, Pro-Life Ministry, etc.)

As part of that effort, I am in the process of contacting two groups of people who have yet to make a pledge to our **Legacy for Our Mission capital campaign**. This is the fund drive that is making the restoration of our beautiful church possible. For this reason, our "pledge weekend" for the annual **Stewardship and United Catholic Appeal** will be **Nov. 8-9**. (Most other parishes are doing it a weekend earlier.) These campaigns and such are about as confusing as the liturgical calendars!

The two categories of people I will contact are:

First, those who have been in the parish for some time but have yet to make a gift to the **Legacy for Our Mission capital campaign**.

Second, the parishioners we have had register within the past two years. Keep in mind that our capital campaign really "ended" in early 2007. We have actually had a number of new parishioners since then. I will ask them to be part of the restoration project for our centennial.

Item found in another parish bulletin: *Please place your donation in the envelope along with the deceased person you want remembered.*
