## Bishops congratulate Obama, urge him to defend human life

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops sent a letter of congratulations to Barack Obama following his victory in last week's presidential election. Francis Cardinal George, archbishop of Chicago and president of the USCCB, penned the short message.

Obama has been a vocal supporter of abortion "rights" and other issues that are in direct opposition to the teachings of the Church. He told a meeting of Planned Parenthood in 2007 that his first act as president would be to sign the Freedom of Choice Act, which would void all limitations on abortion passed on the state level.

Here is the text of Cardinal George's letter:

Dear President-elect Obama,

I write to you, in my capacity as President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, to express our congratulations on your historic election as President of the United States. The people of our country have entrusted you with a great responsibility. As Catholic Bishops, we offer our prayers that God give you strength and wisdom to meet the coming challenges.

Our country is confronting many uncertainties. We pray that you will use the powers of your office to meet them with a special concern to defend the most vulnerable among us and heal the divisions in our country and our world. We stand ready to work with you in defense and support of the life and dignity of every human person.

May God bless you and Vice President-elect Biden as you prepare to assume your duties in service to our country and its citizens.

## Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

### A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

We are into **November**, the month of the **Holy Souls**. We pray for all those who have died: the members of our own families, all the deceased members of Holy Rosary Parish and particularly for the most forgotten, lost souls in purgatory — the **Poor Souls**.

This weekend we observe the Feast of the Dedication of what is commonly known as the Church of Saint John Lateran in Rome. Pope Sylvester I dedicated this church on Nov. 9, 324. It is honored as the Episcopal seat of the pope as Bishop of Rome. In other words, it's the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome. Saint Peter's Basilica at Vatican City is not actually their cathedral; Saint John Lateran is.

Catholics honor this church "*omnium ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis mater et caput*," meaning "mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world." It was the residence of the popes from the fourth century until their moving to Avignon in 1309, and the site of five ecumenical councils.

Saint John Lateran was first dedicated to Our Savior, then later to Saint John the Baptist. The

name "Lateran" honors the Laterani Family who owned the land on which this beautiful church was built. Think of it as similar to "naming rights" for a big benefactor ala Lucas Oil Stadium or Conseco Fieldhouse. Well, not quite, but you get the picture.

In case you are interested, I am giving an **evening of recollection** at the Benedict Inn in Beech Grove on Tuesday, Nov. 18, at 6:30 p.m. It's part of their "Catholic Identity" series. My topic is "**A People of Worship: Sacramental Life**." The fee is \$25 and includes a box picnic dinner. To register, call 788-7581. (I am also having a "private" Mass preceded by confessions for Members of the Knights and Dames of Malta begin-

ning at 5:30 p.m. Although it's primarily just for that group, Holy Rosary parishioners attending the session are invited too.)

**Receiving Gratefully — Giving Generously: Stewardship** is the acknowledgement that all we are and have comes from God. Each autumn, we as a parish at **Holy Rosary**, along with more than 80,000 other households in our archdiocese, reflect on our commitment to be good stewards of all that God's Providence has given us.

**E**ach autumn, we as a parish at Holy Rosary, along with more than 80,000 other households in our archdiocese, reflect on our commitment to be good stewards of all that God's Providence has given us.

By receiving God's gifts gratefully and sharing our God-given gifts, we allow Christ — through us — to serve His people. In fact, the theme of our **Called to Serve** campaign is *Receiving Gratefully — Giving Generously*.

**Stewardship** Commitment weekend is this weekend. We ask that everyone turn in his or her **Stewardship** commitment card in the collection basket. Everyone is asked to turn in an "intention card." If you did not receive one in the mail, there are some extras in the back. There are three parts to this **Stewardship** Commitment card. The top front has a place for your name and address. The first one is in a sense, a "no brainer." *Do we plan to attend Mass and pray regularly for God's work through our Church?* Of course, if we don't do this then we are certainly not a Catholic "in good standing!"

On the front side of the card, number three asks about your financial gift to Holy Rosary Parish. It would be helpful if you could at least estimate would it might be weekly, monthly or yearly. It would be more than very helpful if you could increase the amount of your financial support from what it is now. Utilities, insurance, salaries, supplies all go up every year.

The bottom of the front side asks for our Stewardship support of the **United Catholic Appeal**. All gifts to the **United Catholic Appeal** go to two areas:

The first is **home missions** — parishes that

simply cannot make it on their own. These churches could not keep their doors open unless they have help from the rest of us. The second are **shared ministries** — things that the Church must do, but we it together. Examples are Holy Family Shelter for the Homeless, Saint Elizabeth's Pregnancy and Adoption Services, the Office for Pro-Life Ministry and Birthline.

The bottom on the backside of the card is a guide or a chart to giving. For example, a gift of just 34 cents a day amounts to a gift to **The United Catholic Appeal** of \$125 a year. 66 cents a day is \$242! What I am really hoping and praying for is 100% participation from all parishioners. That way you can say that you are united with the rest of us in this appeal.

**I**t would be more than very helpful if you could increase the amount of your financial support from what it is now. Utilities, insurance, salaries, supplies all go up every year.

On the front, please mark both top and bottom of the card in reference to your financial gifts. In the middle of the card, number three, is for the parish. At the very bottom it's for the **United Catholic Appeal**. This is a bit confusing.

Although the card is perforated, do not separate the card. We will do this in the parish office. Be sure to include your full name and address at the very top if it is not printed there already.

If you need more time to reflect on your commitment, drop it off at the parish office or mail it to us. I must say, however, that putting the card into the Offertory collection has more of a symbolic spiritual meaning.
