Help expand school choice

With bipartisan support, the Indiana Senate recently passed Senate Bill 528, the School Scholarship Tax Credit program. This initiative would provide a 50 percent tax credit to an individual or corporation who donates to a scholarship granting organization. These scholarships would help pay tuition for thousands of lower- and middle-income families to attend the private or public school of their choice.

The bill moved to the Indiana House where it is waiting for a hearing from the Ways and Means Committee, which consists of representatives Ed Delaney, Cherish Pryor, Bill Crawford and John Day. SB 528 is strongly supported by the Indiana Catholic Conference and the Indiana Non-Public Education Association.

We encourage our parishioners to contact their state representatives and ask them to vote in favor of the legislation. Please take one of the postcards in the back of church (near the picture of Dr. and Mrs. Daly) and return it to the parish; we will mail it for you.

Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Saint Joseph's Table Day! The month of March is typically associated with Saint Patrick's Day and the first day of spring, but falling halfway between those days is another day that deserves just as much recognition. Although Saint Joseph did not rid an island of snakes, people from Sicily are as devoted to him as the Irish are to Saint Patrick.

In the Middle Ages, Sicilians prayed to Saint Joseph to end a famine caused by a drought. When their prayers were answered and it rained, the people showed their thanks to Saint Joseph by sharing precious food with the poor.

Continuing that tradition, in some places altars are erected that consist of at least three tiers to symbolize the Trinity. At the center of the table is a picture or statue of Saint Joseph surrounded by flowers and candles. The altar and the food are blessed, so none of the food may be wasted. The poor are often invited to **Saint Joseph Day** celebrations to enjoy the food that is prepared but, more often now, collections are taken to be given to charities.

In some places, the signature dish of **Saint Joseph's Table** is *pasta con mudrica*, or pasta with sawdust. Spaghetti is tossed with oil and breadcrumbs, to resemble sawdust representing Saint Joseph's work as a carpenter. (It doesn't sound appetizing, but it is; I've tried it.)

Here at *la Chiesa del Santo Rosario*, the tradition of **Saint Joseph's Table** continues. Today (Sunday) in the adjacent CYO Dan and Mag Corsaro Gymnasium, there will be a deli-

icious array of Italian food served from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and prepared by our own David Page. Don't miss it! *Lumen Christi* Catholic School (a private Catholic school located here) helps us continue the tradition of **Saint Joseph's Table**. Proceeds go toward Catholic school education. *Viva la tavola di San Giuseppe!*

Our annual Lenten adult education series, *Spaghetti & Spirituality*, continued this last Wednesday with a record crowd — over 320. Father Tadeusz Pacholczyk, director of education for the National Catholic Bioethics Center, did a wonderful job in making clear the implications of cloning and stem cell research.

This was especially timely since President Obama has just signed an order that makes it possible for Federal money to be spent on embryonic stem cell research. Our tax dollars will be used to collaborate in the horrendous process of destroying human life.

This week, our format for *Spaghetti & Spirituality* will differ. Tomorrow (Monday) we begin our *Quaranta Ore di Adorazione Eucaristica* or Forty Hours Devotion. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will begin after evening Mass Monday and continue Monday night through Wednesday. **There is a sign-up sheet in the back for you to sign-up for an hour of Adoration. Each hour must be filled**

There will be the usual schedule of Masses and confessions during this time. The full schedule is in this bulletin. Each evening at 6:30 p.m. we will have a special service (not a Mass) consisting of Benediction of the Blessed

Sacrament, special prayers, and a sermon by Father James Jackson, F.S.S.P. I am delighted that Father Jackson is with us; you will be, too.

A few years ago, you might remember that our preacher was Father Timothy Alkire of Lafayette. I'll never forget what Father Alkire once wrote to his parish, Saint Boniface: "*How I understand myself personally the many demands made on our time, which tempt us to believe that we have no time for adoration... but ponder deeply the meaning of adoration, of how Jesus remains with us really and truly in the Eucharist! Ponder how joyful He is when we visit Him, how much good is done in our souls and in others through our lives, which have become more fervent in His presence.*"

On the final night of Forty Hours, we will have the Solemn Closing at 6:30 p.m. This will be preceded by the beautiful Solemn High Mass in the Extraordinary Form (Latin Mass) beginning at 5:15 p.m. We will celebrate the vigil of the Feast of the great Saint Joseph. Don't miss it; bring your friends, especially those who may not have ever attended the Traditional Latin Mass, much less a Solemn High Mass. Note the earlier start time: 5:15 p.m. Then our grand celebration is the spaghetti dinner in Priori Hall following the service.

Please plan to attend each evening, Monday through Wednesday, at 6:30 p.m.

Each weekend during **Lent** we will have a second collection to remind us of the need for almsgiving. This weekend it will be for one of the best tools of Evangelization we have in our area, **Catholic Radio Indianapolis, 89.1 FM.**

Next weeks' second collection will be for **Catholic Relief Services.** This year's theme is "Jesus in Disguise." This saying from Blessed Teresa of Calcutta reminds us that Christ is present in those who suffer, and in those who respond compassionately to their needs. This

collection supports important Catholic organizations that carry out God's work around the world: providing refugee resettlement, HIV/AIDS and international poverty relief, legal aid for poor immigrants, emergency and disaster relief. Please know that your generosity gives hope to "Jesus in Disguise."

Prayer is essential for the observance of **Lent**. Listed elsewhere in the bulletin is the schedule of additional Masses and services for Lent. Try to attend some extra Masses on weekdays during Lent. Sign up for an hour of Adoration during the day for our **Forty Hours** Monday through Wednesday. Take an odd hour in the middle of the night; it can be a grace-filled time alone with the Lord. What a perfect practice for Lent!

Penance is also essential during Lent. And not just during Lent either. We abstain from meat on all Fridays during **Lent**. This also includes receiving the **Sacrament of Penance**. Keep in mind that confessions are heard here before each Mass seven days a week.

As you know, we sing of some of the parts of Mass in the Ordinary Form in Latin, the official language of the Church, as requested by Vatican II. If you are unfamiliar with the Latin for the *Sanctus* (Holy, Holy) and the *Agnus Dei* (Lamb of God), they are printed in the monthly missalette on pages 196-201.

Thanks to so many of you for your birthday greetings and gifts last week. Gee, I was only 50 when I came to Holy Rosary! Time flies when you are having fun. And I am.

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
