Catholic voices decry scandal at Notre Dame

As everyone surely must know by now, the University of Notre Dame — our state's and country's most prominent Catholic university — has invited President Obama to deliver this year's commencement address and to receive an honorary degree. In light of the president's unwavering support for abortion, the university's invitation has set off a hailstorm of criticism throughout the Church.

Our own Archbishop Daniel Beuchlein, O.S.B., has written a thoughtful letter to Notre Dame's president, Fr. John Jenkins, a Holy Cross Father, decrying the school's decision. In his letter, which was published recently in *The Criterion*, the archbishop stated he was "stunned and angered" by the school president's decision.

Francis Cardinal George, archbishop of Chicago and president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, has urged faithful Catholics to "do what you are supposed to be doing: to call, to e-mail, to write letters, to express what's in your heart about this (scandal)."

Dozens of other bishops and priests have also written letters and made similar statements in opposition to the invitation. Bishop Joseph Martino of Scranton, Pa., for one, has specifically urged faithful Catholics to sign the petition at www.NotreDameScandal.com.

Similar petitions are available elsewhere online, and letters can be sent directly to Fr. Jenkins at the university.

Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

Alleluia! He is risen! *Alleluia!* Again, I want to thank everyone who had a hand in making the celebration of Easter so wonderful again here at Holy Rosary. Our church looked (and looks) magnificent! *Alleluia!*

We celebrate for the next several weeks the greatest of Christian feasts, the Resurrection of Jesus. In fact, **Easter** is such a major celebration that it lasts fifty days — right up until **Pentecost** Sunday.

Father Magiera is away for a well-deserved vacation. We welcome Father Charles Ryan, F.S.S.P., who will be with us during Father's absence. Father Magiera will return to Holy Rosary on Thursday.

(Today) Sunday is "**Divine Mercy Sunday**." We also traditionally call it "Low Sunday." A Polish nun, Sister Faustina, inspired the Divine Mercy devotion. **Divine Mercy Sunday** henceforth is to be celebrated by the Universal Church throughout the world on the Sunday following Easter Sunday. The particular theme of the "**Divine Mercy**" devotion is God's endless goodness and mercy.

The major observance of **Divine Mercy** will be at 3 p.m. at Saint Michael Church, 30th Street and Tibbs Avenue. This is the place locally where this devotion first began to be observed

a number of years ago. I will conduct this service. I hope you can attend.

Recall that Jesus died on the cross at mid-afternoon, 3 p.m. The **Divine Mercy** Service is not a Mass. It consists of Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the "Divine Mercy Chaplet," a series of short prayers using a regular rosary, a sermon and a procession with the Blessed Sacrament.

Next Sunday, second graders from *Lumen Christi* School will make their First Holy Communion here at the noon Mass. This Mass will undoubtedly be more crowded than usual.

I mentioned a couple weeks ago that when I was in Rome last month I finally visited the Church of Saint George in Velabro (*the Basilica di San Giorgio in Velabro, Roma*). According to our parish history, this little church near the Roman Coliseum was part of the inspiration for the construction of our *la Chiesa del Santo Rosario*. Our founding pastor, Msgr. Marino Priori, must have visited it several times.

I've put some postcard pictures of *San Giorgio in Velabro* on the bulletin board in the vestibule. I think you can see some similarity between the bell towers, the roofs and the façades. We have two bell towers; *San Giorgio in Velabro* only has one. I don't have any pictures (yet) of the interior. But there is no com-

parison there; the two are very unlike.

I was fascinated by several "connections" between us and *San Giorgio*. I picked up a little booklet giving the history of the Roman church. It dates back centuries. *San Giorgio in Velabro* is now staffed by the Crosier Fathers (Canons Regular of the Holy Cross).

The history book was written by a former rector, a Rev. Richard T. John, O.S.C., then residing in Fort Wayne, Indiana! I plan to try to contact Father John and invite him to our centennial celebration on May 9. (The Crosier Fathers have long had a presence in northern Indiana. They used to staff Wawasee Prep on Lake Wawasee.)

To make a long story short, the Cardinals of the Catholic Church all have what they call their "titular parish church." In recent times, it's largely an honorary sort of thing. *San Giorgio in Velabro* was at one time (1879-1890) the titular church of the great John Henry Cardinal Newman.

San Giorgio at one time (1967-1970) was also the titular church of Benno Cardinal Gut. Cardinal Gut was a Benedictine monk from the great Benedictine Abbey in Einsiedeln, Switzerland. Einsiedeln is the place from which some Swiss monks ventured to found Saint Meinrad in southern Indiana. One more "connection!"

Our **centennial** celebration will be here before you know it! Archbishop Buechlein will be here to celebrate Mass and rededicate our church Saturday, May 9, at 4:30 p.m. This is followed by our dinner-dance at Primo South. If you want more details, call the parish office.

Parishioner Mary Ann Wyand is also editing a special centennial book modeled after the magazine our parish published years ago, *Eternal Light*. We do not plan to completely finish the book and put it on sale until after May 9. We want to include stories and pictures from the celebration itself.

Speaking of celebrations, don't forget the **175th Anniversary of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis**. This is our 175th year, having been established first as the Diocese of Vincennes in 1834. The major liturgical celebration of this will be a Mass at Lucas Oil Stadium on Sunday, May 3, at 3 p.m.

Archbishop Buechlein will be the main celebrant. We will have about sixteen other bishops, Francis Cardinal George from Chicago and two Benedictine abbots. More than 150 priests of the archdiocese will be there, too.

About 2,500 of our young people will be confirmed. We will also honor First Communicants of spring 2009 plus persons celebrating major jubilees of marriage or consecrated life this year. Everyone is invited. On that day, May 3, we will not have a noon Mass. More on this later!

Of one thing I am convinced; of one thing I am certain: Providence never fails!
