Appunti del Parroco: (From the Pastor's Notebook:)

A Letter from Msgr. Joseph F. Schaedel, V.G.

Dear Parishioners,

This is the “big weekend” for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis; we are 175 years old! We were founded as the Diocese of Vincennes in 1834. At that time the diocese covered all of Indiana and the Eastern half of Illinois. If you have been to Vincennes, you may have visited our original cathedral, the Basilica of Saint Francis Xavier. It's right next door to the George Rogers Clark Memorial on the banks of the Wabash.

If you have not been there, it's worth a visit. Saint Francis Xavier is the patron of the archdiocese as well as the patron saint of our original cathedral.

Our first bishop, Simon Bruté, is buried in the crypt of the basilica. His cause for canonization is now being pursued by the archdiocese. The church is beautiful. There is also a wonderful museum attached to the church.

Recently, when Mother Theodore Guerin was canonized she became the patroness of the archdiocese. I understand that the Holy See does not ordinarily allow a diocese to add a patron, but in this case the permission came quickly. She is our own Indiana saint!

Our 175th Anniversary Mass is today (Sunday, May 3), at Lucas Oil Stadium. We expect about 40,000 persons. About 2,600 young people and adults will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. More than a hundred

couples and vowed religious will be honored on their Golden Jubilees and beyond. Some are from Holy Rosary.

First Communicants of Spring 2009 will be honored. Holy Rosary's First Communicants of 2009 will be represented by Jack Gorsage and Nicholas Woods.

Father Magiera and I will participate along with about 200 priests, deacons, archbishops, bishops and abbots. Archbishop Buechlein will be the main celebrant and preach. Francis Cardinal George of Chicago will be present.

Everyone is invited to Lucas Oil Stadium for this Mass. Details were in our

archdiocesan newspaper, *The Criterion*, last week. You can also get information on the archdiocesan Web Site, www.archindy.org.

Yours truly is the general chair of this event at the football stadium. This is one of the main reasons we have no noon Mass this weekend. We also encourage folks to attend the Mass at 3 p.m.

Our own **parish centennial** is the next weekend. *La Chiesa del Santo Rosario* was founded in May 1909. All registered parishioners should have received an invitation to our **Centennial Mass on Saturday, May 9, at 4:30 p.m.** Archbishop Buechlein will be the main celebrant.

The Mass will be followed by a **dinner-**

dance (with live music) at *Primo South*. If you did not receive an invitation — or need more information — please call the parish office at 636-4478. The Centennial Committee has been working very hard on the celebration for months. I know it is going to be wonderful. I also hope to see you there.

We have a contingency plan for the Mass. Come early; it will be crowded. Since our church comfortably seats only about 325, we will have additional seats in Priori Hall where people can watch the Mass on a TV screen. We will make arrangements for the overflow crowd downstairs to receive Holy Communion. And, of course, we will make arrangements to pass the basket down there as well!

Our own Branden Stanley and his *Starlight Media Productions* will take care of “broadcasting” the Mass to the crowd in Priori Hall. This also means that we will have a DVD of the Mass available in the weeks to come. Branden

has also produced a slideshow-type video which will be shown continuously at Primo Banquet Hall. He will also roam about the dinner-dance taking pictures (so behave yourself!).

The music for our **Centennial Mass** will be provided by the Master's Chorale augmented by some of our own choir members and other accompanists. Father Magiera, who is also the chaplain for the Master's Chorale, has been working with the group to plan the music. It will be great!

Other centennial events will follow in 2009: our centennial year **Italian Street Festival** on

June 12-13, the publication of our **centennial** edition of *Eternal Light* (parish history book fashioned after the magazine our parish once published), and a centennial-year concert by our own Father Michael Magiera and special guests.

May Crowning will take place the next day on our **centennial weekend** which is also Mothers' Day, at the noon Mass. Mary, Queen of the Holy Rosary, is our patroness!

I am leading a pilgrimage to EWTN and the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Alabama. We leave by bus on July 22 and return July 24. Total cost is \$297. For more information or additional details, call Norbert Linden-


maier at 786-1684. I've been to both places before and look forward to going again. Think about joining us.
